Curriculum Presentations – All Teachers

- Ms. Stanley
 - First graders are being leaders in the classroom- they have Kindergarten buddies.
 - First grade reading is focusing on reviewing (short vowels, blends), word work independent, different learning centers.
 - First grade is starting with Dreambox and Lexia.

- Kindergarten reading is focusing on learning how to start to be independent, phonics activities, mastering letters and sounds and putting the two together, and working on high frequency words.
- Kindergarten is started using computers slowly,
- o First grade is working data/surveys, graphs and reading data in math.
- Kindergarten is working on using different manipulatives and using games to learn math.
- Each day there is time to read aloud. We are about to finish our 3rd read aloud. There is also reading independently and looking at library books on Wednesdays.
- Art is on Wednesdays. Some art will come home and some will be kept for Winter Event.
- o In science we are learning about the life cycle of plants. We got to see pumpkin flowers at the pumpkin patch.
- We have an expectation Experts chart to help students learn school and classroom routines and expectations. Every time they demonstrate an expectation they get a smiley face. The students choose the four expectations that are working on at a time. They chose keep from erupting, listen and follow directions, we can stay on task and focused, have and quiet transitions.
- We are doing creative storytelling. Students create stories and present to the class, they make the characters and setting on Wednesdays.
- o Design time includes free choice, Legos, and magnatiles.
- Swapping classes on Fridays there are not Friday specials for Discovery Time.
- o For the Learning Celebration we students researching a question that they have.

- Reading- asking and answering questions, using part of the question in the answer, Lexia, Read to Self, Partner work
- Math- 2nd (adding and subtracting on a number line, weekly fluency fact practice)
- o Math- 3rd beginning multiplication, DreamBox, challenge pages, math games
- o Writing -personal narrative, seed story, beginning, middle, and end
- Art- Leaves, sunflowers, art every day (videos and teacher led)
- Read Aloud- 15-20 minutes every day after lunch (currently reading The One and Only Ruby)

- Science- weather and climate
